APPLE, DWARF and SEMI-DWARF

* **Braeburn:** Late harvest season, excellent flavor, mildly sweet and tart. Aromatic with firm, crisp and juicy texture. Very late maturing with excellent storage life. Grows in height up to 25 feet. Bears fruit is 4 - 6 years and will produce 10+ bushels at maturity. Best when planted within 100 yards of another apple variety. From New Zealand cross between Granny Smith and Lady Hamilton, named after Braeburn Orchard where it was first commercially grown

Fuji: Late harvest season, tree is vigorous and very productive. The skin is straw colored with a red blush, flavor is a balance between sweet and tart. Long shelf life. Grows in height up to 20 feet. Bears fruit is 4 - 6 years and will produce 8-12 bushels at maturity. Best when planted within 100 yards of another apple variety. From Japan cross between Red Delicious and Ralls Genet. Excellent pollinizer for other apples.

* **Gala:** Mid harvest season, tree is large, skin is bright scarlet striped over with yellow. Flavor is semi-sweet, very juicy. Apple is excellent quality, keeps very well. Self-fruitful. Grows in height up to 20 feet. Bears fruit is 4 - 6 years and will produce 8-10 bushels at maturity. From New Zealand, cross between Kidds Orange Red and Golden Delicious

- **Granny Smith:** Mid harvest season, tree is large, skin is bright scarlet striped over with yellow. Flavor is semi-sweet, very juicy. Apple is excellent quality, keeps very well. Self-fruitful. Grows in height up to 20 feet. Bears fruit is 4 - 6 years and will produce 8-10 bushels at maturity. From Australia, all purpose, crisp, tart, excellent keeper, prolonged bloom: good pollinizer for other apples

* **Gravenstein:** Early harvest season, tree is upright and spreading. Fruit is medium to large, skin color is light green with red stripes. Apple has fine

texture and is crisp and juicy. It is good for canning, cooking and fresh eating. From Denmark. Require Pollinator, pollen sterile. Grows in height up to 20 feet. Bears fruit is 4 – 6 years and will produce 8+ bushels at maturity. Must be planted within 100 yards of another apple variety. Famous for sauce and baking, also used fresh, crisp, juicy, flavorful, tart, early bloom early harvest,

* **Honeycrisp:** (P.P. 7197) Mid harvest season. Fruit is large size, skin is scarlet red over yellow. Apple has a sweet tart flavor, juicy and crisp. Red Delicious and Snowdrift Crab are good Pollinators. Grows in height up to 25 feet. Bears fruit is 4 – 6 years and will produce 10+ bushels at maturity. Best when planted within 100 yards of another apple variety. Add \$1.55 to the price for each, royalty.

* **Lodi:** Mid harvest season, tree is large, skin is bright scarlet striped over with yellow. Flavor is semi-sweet, very juicy. Apple is excellent quality, keeps very well. Self-fruitful. Grows in height up to 20 feet. Bears fruit is 4 – 6 years and will produce 8-10 bushels at maturity.

* **Jonagold:** Late harvest season, tree is sturdy. Fruit is large, skin is yellow/green with red stripes. Apple has coarse texture, is crisp and juicy. Good for all cooking, stores and freezes well. Cross of Jonathon and Golden Delicious apples. Requires Pollinator, pollen is sterile. Grows in height up to 15 feet. Bears fruit is 4 – 6 years and will produce 10+ bushels at maturity. Best when planted within 100 yards of another apple variety. Superb flavor – connoisseurs choice. Cross of Jonathan and Golden Delicious, pollinated by fuji, gala, granny smith or red delicious,

- **Liberty:** Mid harvest season, tree is large, skin is bright scarlet striped over with yellow. Flavor is semi-sweet, very juicy. Apple is excellent quality, keeps very well. Self-fruitful. Grows in height up to 20 feet. Bears fruit is 4 – 6 years and will produce 8-10 bushels at maturity.

* **Red McIntosh:** Mid harvest season, tree has vigorous growth habits and is very good in cool areas. Fruit is medium, skin is red. Apple is sweet and tender. Good for dessert, requires Pollinator. Grows in height up to 20 feet. Bears fruit is 4 – 6 years and will produce heavily at maturity. Best when planted within 100 yards of another apple variety.

* **Spartan:** Late harvest season, tree is strong and very heavy producer. Fruit is medium, skin color is red. Apple is crisp, firm, juicy and very aromatic. Good

for fresh eating and desserts, good keeper. Grows in height up to 30 feet. Bears fruit is 4 – 6 years and will produce up to 12 bushels at maturity. Best when planted within 100 yards of another apple variety.

* **Wealthy:** Mid harvest season, tree is large, skin is bright scarlet striped over with yellow. Flavor is semi-sweet, very juicy. Apple is excellent quality, keeps very well. Self-fruitful. Grows in height up to 20 feet. Bears fruit is 4 – 6 years and will produce 8-10 bushels at maturity.

* **Yellow Transparent:** Mid harvest season, tree is large, skin is bright scarlet striped over with yellow. Flavor is semi-sweet, very juicy. Apple is excellent quality, keeps very well. Self-fruitful. Grows in height up to 20 feet. Bears fruit is 4 – 6 years and will produce 8-10 bushels at maturity.

PEAR, STANDARD & DWARF

* **D'Anjou:** Mid harvest season. Fruit is large, skin is light green. Pear has fine texture and is mild and juicy. Very good for fresh eating. Grows in height from 18 – 28 feet. Best when planted within 100 yards of another pear variety. Bears fruit in 2 – 3 years. Large, short-necked, firm, good quality, keeps well. Harvest late September

* **Bartlett:** Early harvest season, vigorous tree. Fruit is medium to large, skin color green and ripens to yellow. Pear is sweet and tender. Good for fresh eating and canning. Ripens without cold storage. Tree grows in height from 18 – 28 feet. Bears fruit in 3 – 5 years. No Pollinator required. Worlds most popular pear. Mid-season, high quality, tolerates hot summers, pollinated by bosc, D'Anjou,

* **Bosc:** Mid harvest season. Tree is large with upright growth. Fruit is large and narrow shape with a long neck. Skin color is dark yellow with russet. Pear is juicy, sweet and tender. Good for canning and fresh eating. Grows in height from 18 – 28 feet. Best when planted within 100 yards of another pear variety. Bears fruit in 3 – 5 years. Long & narrow shape, brown skin, superb quality, one of the best Harvest late October/November. Fresh/cooked, Pollinated by Bartlett or other pear

Comice: Late harvest season, tree is large and slow to bear fruit. Fruit is large, skin is yellow with russet dots. Pear is sweet, tender and aromatic. Best Winter pear. Requires cold storage to ripen. Tree grows in height from 18 – 28 feet. Bears fruit in 3 – 5 years. No Pollinator required. The gift pack pear.

Sweet, aromatic, fine texture, superb flavor and quality- one of the best short neck, greenish-yellow skin with red blush, Late harvest, self-fruitful or plant with Bartlett

* **Red Bartlett:** Early harvest season, vigorous tree. Fruit is medium to large, skin color is red. Pear is sweet and tender. Good for fresh eating and canning. Ripens without cold storage. Tree grows in height from 18 - 20 feet. Bears fruit in 3 - 5 years.

PEAR, ASIAN - DWARF & SEMI-DWARF

* **Hosui:** Early harvest season, tree is vigorous and very productive. Tangy taste. Self-fruitful but to ensure pollination use 20th Century. Grows to height of 18+ feet. Bears fruit in 1 - 3 years. Will provide 100+ pears a season at maturity. Can be self-fertile but best when planted within 100 yards of another pear variety. Large, juicy, sweet, flavorful, refreshing, crisp like an apple, brownish-orange russeted skin, harvest late August/September, poll by Bartlett, 20th century

* **Nijisseiki / 20th Century:** Mid harvest season, tree is medium in size upright and spreading. Fruit is round, skin color is greenish yellow with some green blush. Pear is sweet and slightly tart, firm and juicy. Pollinators are Bartlett, Chojuro and Skinseiki. Grows to height of 18+ feet. Bears fruit in 2 - 3 years. Will provide 6 - 8 bushels at maturity. Best when planted within 100 yards of another pear variety. Juicy, sweet, mild flavored fruit is crisp like an apple. Mid/late August, keeps well, easy to grow, heavy bearing self-fruitful or poll by Shinseiki, Bartlett

* **Shinseiki :** Mid harvest season, tree is medium in size upright and spreading. Fruit is round, skin color is greenish yellow with some green blush. Pear is sweet and slightly tart, firm and juicy. Pollinators are Bartlett, Chojuro and Skinseiki. Grows to height of 18+ feet. Bears fruit in 2 - 3 years. Will provide 6 - 8 bushels at maturity. Best when planted within 100 yards of another pear variety. Juicy, sweet refreshing, crisp like an apple, easy to grow, keeps well, harvest mid August, bright yellow skin, vigorous, heavy bearing self-fruitful.

* **Puget Gold:** Late harvest season. Tree bears prolifically. Fruit is large and has a good flavor. Freestone. Partially self-fertile. Grows in height up to 25 feet. Consistent bearer. Proven producer of large flavorful fruit in western Washington. Self-fruitful

* **Tilton:** Mid harvest season. Tree bears heavy. Fruit is very large, skin is orange. Apricot has a good flavor when eaten fresh. Grows in height to 25 feet. Bears fruit in 3 - 5 years. Self-fertile. No. 1 apricot for canning, excellent fresh or dried as well, Medium to large, firm, rich flavor- one of the best.

PLUM, DWARF

* **Blue Damson:** Mid harvest season. Tree grows upright. Fruit is medium in size. Skin color is solid deep red. Plum is semi-freestone with a small pit; sweet taste. Outstanding for fresh eating or canning. Pollinator required, recommend Santa Rosa. Grows in height up to 20 feet. Bears fruit 2 - 3 years.

* **Santa Rosa:** Early harvest season. Tree is large and hardy. Fruit also large with a cone shape. Skin color is a deep purplish red. Plum has a sweet tart taste and is firm. Excellent for fresh eating. Slow ripening. Self-fertile. Grows in height to 25 feet. Bears fruit in 3 - 5 years. Juicy, tangy, flavorful, reddish-purple skin, amber flesh tinged red. Late July harvest self-fruitful

* **Satsuma:** Mid harvest season. Tree grows upright. Fruit is medium in size. Skin color is solid deep red. Plum is semi-freestone with a small pit; sweet taste. Outstanding for fresh eating or canning. Pollinator required, recommend Santa Rosa. Grows in height up to 20 feet. Bears fruit 2 - 3 years. Mottled maroon over green skin, dark red meaty flesh. Sweet, mild not tart, excellent for jam, harvest

late august

* **Shiro:** Mid harvest season. Tree grows upright. Fruit is medium in size. Skin color is solid deep red. Plum is semi-freestone with a small pit; sweet taste. Outstanding for fresh eating or canning. Pollinator required, recommend Santa Rosa. Grows in height up to 20 feet. Bears fruit 2 – 3 years. Medium size greenish-yellow fruit is juicy, moderately sweet with a pleasing mild flavor, bears reliably in many climates, harvest late july, self-fruitful

* **Superior:** Mid harvest season. Tree grows upright. Fruit is medium in size. Skin color is solid deep red. Plum is semi-freestone with a small pit; sweet taste. Outstanding for fresh eating or canning. Pollinator required, recommend Santa Rosa. Grows in height up to 20 feet. Bears fruit 2 – 3 years.

PRUNE, DWARF

* **Italian:** Late harvest season. Tree is hardy, gives a heavy crop. Fruit is large and oval. Skin color is purplish black. Prune tastes sweet with some tartness. Good for fresh eating. Grows 15 – 20 feet in height, can have wide spread. Late bloomer and is better adapted to areas with late frosts or cool, rainy, Spring weather. High sugar content makes sun-drying fruit possible. Large, purple-skin, freestone, rich flavor, very sweet when fully ripe, best fresh/dried/canned, vigorous, cold hardy tree, late bloom, late summer harvest, self-fruitful

* **Stanley:** Late harvest season. Tree is large, spreading and bears young. Fruit is large. Skin color is dark blue. Prune is tender and sweet. Good for cooking and fresh eating. Self-fertile. Grows in height up to 20 feet. Bears fruit in 3 – 5 years.

* **Brooks:** Late harvest season. Tree breaks early and is a heavy producer. Fruit is large and oval in shape. Skin color is purplish black. Prune is sweet with some acid. Oregon prune, good for drying and canning. Self-fertile. Grows in height up to 20 feet. Bears fruit young.

SWEET CHERRY, SEMI-DWARF

* **Bing:** Mid harvest season. Tree produces heavy crop and has spreading growth. Fruit is top quality and large. Skin color is dark burgundy red. Cherry is meaty, sweet and juicy. Excellent for canning. Requires Pollinator. Grows in height up to 20 feet. Bears fruit in 2 – 3 years. Best when planted within 100 yards of another cherry variety. Large, firm juicy, sweet, nearly black when

ripe, superb flavor, the No. 1 cherry, Mid season, large vigorous tree,

* **Black Tartarian:** Early harvest season. Tree grows quickly and is very productive. Fruit is medium in size. Skin color is bright purplish black. Cherry is firm and sweet. One of the earliest cherries. Pollinator could be any sweet cherry. Grows in height up to 20 feet. Bears fruit in 2 - 3 years. Best when planted within 100 yards of another cherry variety. Medium sized, nearly black, early season

* **Lambert:** Early harvest season. Tree blooms late with vigorous growth. Fruit is large, skin color is black. Cherry is firm and sweet. Outstanding for fresh eating. Pollinators could be Sam or Van. Best when planted within 100 yards of another cherry variety. Large, black, late harvest, highest quality, rivaling bing, less susceptible to cracking due to later season

* **Lapins:** Early harvest season. Fruit is large, dark and firm. Excellent flavor and texture. Semi-fertile sweet cherry. Grows in height up to 20 feet. Bears fruit in 2 - 3 years. From Canada, dark red, sweet cherry, large firm, good flavor, similar to van in color

* **Rainier:** Early harvest season. Tree is upright and productive. Fruit is shaped like a Bing. Skin is yellow with red blush. Cherry is firm and sweet. Pollinator suggested Bing, Sam and Van. Grows in height up to 20 feet. Bears fruit in 2 - 3 years. Best when planted within 100 yards of another cherry variety. Large, yellow with red bluch, sweet and flavorful, superior to royal ann, very cold hardy, mid season harvest.

* **Van:** Mid harvest season. Tree is hardy and bears early. Fruit is medium in size, skin color is shiny dark. Cherry is very much like the Bing but more tart. Tree bears heavy and is resistant to cracking. Pollinators suggested are Bing, Lambert and Royal Ann. Grows in height up to 20 feet. Bears fruit in 2 - 3 years. Best when planted within 100 yards of another cherry variety. Very cold hardy, reliable, heavy bearing, fine fruit similar to bing though usually smaller

SOUR CHERRY, SEMI-DWARF

* **Montmorency:** Mid harvest season. Tree is hardy and produces heavy with medium to large spread. Fruit is large. Skin color is bright red. Cherry's flavor is tart. The best pie cherry. Used commercially. Grows in height up to 30 feet.

Bears fruit in 2 - 3 years. Large, light red skin, yellow flesh, perfect for cobblers, pies, etc. Extremely winter hardy, very heavy bearing

* **Early Elberta:** Mid harvest season. Tree is hardy. Fruit is large, skin color is yellow with some red blush. Peach is a freestone, better flavor than Elberta. Good for canning or freezing. Grows in height up to 25 feet. Bears fruit in 2 - 4 years. Self-fertile. Cannot tolerate extreme cold, late frost.

* **Elberta:** Mid harvest season. Tree is spreading with pink flowers. Fruit is large, skin color is golden with red blush. Peach is freestone. Resistant to brown rot, old variety. Grows in height up to 2 feet. Bears fruit in 3 - 5 years. Self-fertile. Famous yellow freestone, classic, rich, peach flavor: high scoring in taste tests, use fresh, canned, cooked, ripe late august

* **Frost:** Early to mid harvest season. New and resistant to leaf curl. Good in cold regions. Much like the Red Haven. Tree is vigorous and very productive. Grows in height up to 25 feet. Bears fruit in 2 - 4 years. Self-fertile. Cannot tolerate extreme cold, late frost.

- **Golden Jubilee:** Early to mid harvest season. New and resistant to leaf curl. Good in cold regions. Much like the Red Haven. Tree is vigorous and very productive. Grows in height up to 25 feet. Bears fruit in 2 - 4 years. Self-fertile. Cannot tolerate extreme cold, late frost.
